Key Words and Their Definitions

Brokerage: typically a community non-profit that uses the principles of self-determination to perform case management services for adults with intellectual or developmental disabilities. The case manager is called a “personal agent.”

Community: where people with and without disability live, work and play

Congregant: In a group setting

Inclusive/Integrated: open and accessible to people with and without disability

K-Plan: support with ADL’s and IADL’s in home and community

Person-centered: a method of planning for an individual that focuses on their strengths, hopes, and dreams. A set of values, skills, and tools used in person-centered planning and in the personalization of services used by people who need supports provided by service organizations.

Segregated: settings where people with disabilities are set apart from people without disability

Self-determination: a philosophy and process by which individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities are empowered to gain control over all aspects of their lives.

Waiver: helps people get long-term care services in the community rather than in an intensive care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities, a nursing home, or hospital
