It's about trajectory! It's never too early to start dreaming big dreams for the future. Kindergarten is the beginning of a long journey for your child-and your advocacy makes a difference.



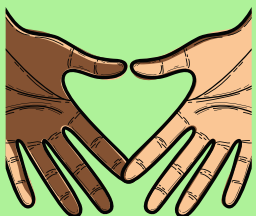
In kindergarten, the focus changes from family to student. The Individualized Education Program (IEP) is all about your student and their unique needs. The IEP describes what your child's school district will provide so they receive a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE).



Stay involved in your child's education throughout the year! Your child is an important and valuable member of their classroom and their school.



Special education is a service, not a place. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) says kids with disabilities should be educated alongside kids without disabilities to the maximum extent appropriate.
